2024 highlights

FORTALECIMIENTO DE LA RESILIENCIA A TRAVÉS DE LAS FRONTERAS: DISEÑO PARA MITIGAR EL PEOR ESCENARIO POSIBLE

25 OCTOBER, TIJUANA, MEXICO

This workshop formed part of the World Design Capital San Diego Tijuana programme. Attendees represented a diverse mix of organizations, including the Tijuana Civil Protection Agency (led by the City Director of Civil Protection), the Fire Brigade, and CETYS University staff amongst others.



This unique combination of specialists explored emergency management (EM) from fresh perspectives, including communications. The groups tackled scenarios such as campus fire emergencies, active shooter incidents, and a major earthquake in Tijuana, using the "Before-During-After" cycle to discuss actors, measures, resources, and distinctions between risk, hazards, and emergencies. The workshop highlighted how participatory design can effectively facilitate risk and emergency management processes.

The session's interactive boards sparked engaging discussions and inspired ideas for future collaborations, including a follow-up workshop to explore actionable EM strategies. Special thanks go to Jorge Francisco (Jofras) and the CETYS team for their exceptional hosting and interest in future projects.

IIID CONVERSATION

18 JANUARY, ONLINE

This talk discussed the distinctions between this emerging discipline and traditional design, and showcased how design methods bring innovative evidence-based perspectives to the complex challenges presented by natural hazards such as earthquakes, hurricanes, flooding, and wildfires. This role extends far beyond aesthetics, and the discussion will underscore the imperative for collaborative endeavors that encompass a variety of stakeholders and ensure inclusive representation.
